Music Committee Report 2017

The Music Committee meets the first Thursday of each month at 9 am in the Patio Room and you are invited to attend. The Committee consists of: the Music Director, a Lay Board member, and a minimum of 3 members from the Congregation at large. The Committee is responsible for all music within the Villages Chapel, including but not limited to, Worship Services, special events and activities.

For 2017, the Committee consisted of Chairman Gary Hill, Board Representative Carolyn Hill, Carol Strong, Ken Utne, Ginger Smith and Music director Susan Ahlgrimm. The committee was mentored by Pastors Hayden and Unruh, and by Board President Mike Falarski. This group has agreed to carry over as the committee for 2018, subject to Lay Board approval.

The music programs supported by the Committee are each Sunday Worship service, two Sunday evening "Hymn Sings" (at Easter and Thanksgiving), Maundy Thursday, a Christmas Cantata, the program for the Chapel Christmas dinner and an Entertainment/Dessert Night featuring talented Villager singers and instrumentalists. The Committee also selects the hymns we sing each Sunday. We will support these same programs again in 2018 and are evaluating other musical venues that will enhance our Chapel's community outreach capabilities. Again this year, flyers announcing our Easter week program and Christmas Cantata were distributed to all Villagers, greatly enhancing the attendance at these services.

Your Chapel is fortunate to have many talented volunteers who provide the beautiful music we enjoy each Sunday. We have the Chapel choir directed by Susan Ahlgrimm and now accompanied by Catherine Ellacer, very talented professional musicians; the wind ensemble, coordinated by Kathi Levin, a Bell Choir, directed by Earl Levin, a Men's Quartet and Trumpet Trio, both directed by Pastor Unruh and many individual soloists and instrumentalists, including Ron Speer, Phil Strong, Eldred Kunkel, Brad Kunkel, Ginger Smith, Madelaine Yannaccone, Earl Levin, Paulette Dudley, Walt Hlavacek, Judi Falarski, Gary Hill and Susan Ahlgrimm

We must mention some exceptional ladies without whom the music program would be severely hampered. These are our volunteer accompanists, Tammy Welsh, Nancy Miller, Nadine Tubbs and Karen Carlsen. Karen doubles on the piano while Catherine plays the organ for the hymns we sing during the service. Nadine is the accompanist for the music outreach program at the Sunrise Independent and Assisted Living Facility. Nancy is available to sub for all the music venues. Tammy substitutes for Catherine as the Worship service accompanist. Our organist and accompanist for several years, Myrna Emata, moved on to play at another church closer to her work location. We are indebted and grateful for her excellent support of the Chapel.

We anticipate another year of excellent music for the Chapel and hope that many of you will be inclined to lend your talents to the program. We welcome your suggestions for possible improvements to our music program, knowing that everything we do is for the glory and praise of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Mission Committee Report 2017

The Mission Committee reviewed a total of 11 missions to support this year. The focus was to find missions that reached out to others for Christ and could gain the most from financial aid in which eight missions were chosen. They are as follows:

Hubbards - Sierra Leone @ 15%, Kenya Evangelical Mission @ 15%, City Team @ 15%, Erik Unruh through the Assembly of God Missions @ 15%, Gideons @ 10%, Medical Institution Chaplain @ 10%, SJ Police Chaplain @ 10%, Kids Club @ 10%.

Each mission was spotlighted for one month. An insert of information was placed in the bulletin for that month. Speakers from six of these missions spoke to the congregation explaining how God has blessed them throughout the year and thanking the Chapel for prayers and financial aid.

God blessed the Chapel greatly this past year by meeting expenses and providing an extra \$15,000 for missions. This brought the total mission giving well over the 25% of the regular giving in past years.

Also, the Easter gift was given to the Kenya Mission, totaling over \$14,000.00 towards the purchase of a van. The combined amount is over 6 times greater than usually given for Easter. The Thanksgiving gift of \$1,240.00 was given to the Hubbards in Sierra Leone to help with the flood damage received earlier in the year. The Christmas gift of over \$2500.00 was sent to the Northern California fire damage, given through the Salvation Army.

Special outreaches included two Food Drives given to God's Pantry in the amount of 10 large boxes of food and 67 Christmas Child boxes were sent as a ministry to reach children around the world for Christ.

Individuals sent over \$2,000.00 directly to the Hubbards in Sierra Leone for flood damage. In addition, funds were also sent to Harvey Relief through the Samaritan's Purse.

Many thanks to the Mission Committee Members, Joyce Bundesen, Bob Busch, Linda denDulk, Teres Ryan, Denise Travis, and Dean Pearson.

Thank you for your support of our missions this past year and I know that God will bless each and everyone of you for your giving and prayer. Praise God!

The membership of this year's *Visitation Committee* consisted of: Chris Bell, Linda denDulk, Connie Jamrock, Judy Heiker, John and Carol Hanagebrauch, Gwen Nakagama, Bob and Beverly Johnson, Ginny Johnson and Ron and Melody Speer.

The format for these visits is based on special needs - rather than regular church member visitation. The committee has ministered in and out of *The Villages*. They have visited the sick and lonely in hospitals and homes. They have served in *Hospitals*, *Senior Centers* as well as *Rehab Centers*.

The visitation program coordinates with Stephen Ministries, The Prayer Team, Flower distribution, and The Shepherd's Basket.

Pastor Emeritus: Although my position is not salaried, I have a job description and access to the Capel Office. I have made monthly reports to the Lay Board. After spending 14 years in the Villages, many bridges have been built within and outside the Chapel family.

During the past year I have spent 15 to 20 hours a week in Chapel related work including:

- over 2000 contacts via phone calls and in person,
- conducted 12 funerals and 1 wedding,
- preached 3 sermons at the Chapel and 17 sermons in area churches.

It has been a very gratifying year. Thank you for the love Arlyn and I have sensed. We share the same love for you.

Stephen Ministry Report 2017

One part of this year's activities included a day retreat entitled" Continuing your Spiritual Journey". The retreat was open to all and we were pleased to have chapel members join us for this special day.

We were also part of the presentation at the New Resident Orientations for the Villages every two months.

Pastor Bill and Pastor Peter are an integral part of our serving the chapel community. They read our reports and make suggestions for contacts at our regular monthly meetings.

As this new year progresses, we ask that the Chapel membership continue to remind friends and neighbors that this caring service is available for support during difficult times. We are ready to extend the hand of friendship and caring for all as we have been called to love and care for one another.

Development Committee Report 2017

The Chapel Board, at the direction of the Board President, explored the possibility of creating a new committee of the Board with the overall goal of addressing the sustainability of the Chapel into the future. This committee, now named the Development Committee, would be tasked with developing methods to increase the Chapel's visibility in the Villages and the surrounding communities. A proposal consistent with the Villages Chapel By-laws for the creation of the the committee was written and presented to the Board, and a resolution creating the committee was passed.

The Development Committee initially included the Pastor, Bill Hayden, the Board President, Mike Falarski, the Board Vice President, Bill Travis, and Phil Strong. A number of meetings were held during the year.

The Committee, including the Pastor, began by discussing and creating for the Lay Board's consideration both long term goals for the Chapel and goals for 2017.

Long term goals were as follows:

- Encourage Chapel members to be more involved in prayer and led by the Holy Spirit in our desire to reach the community for Christ.
- Create new ways for members to become more Christ-like.
- Improve the long term viability and stability of the Chapel as a place of Christian Worship.
- Support and Expand the Mission program.

The 2017 goals were:

- Grow the Chapel membership.
- Increase Chapel congregation involvement in missions apart from financial giving.
- Increase and enhance discipleship by increasing the number of small groups and enhancing weekly group discussions by tying them to the current Sunday message.

As a result, the following ideas were initiated by the Development Committee, discussed with the Board, and implemented:

The Board contracted with a graphic design company, Copacabana Design USA, to create an informational brochure about the Chapel including the Chapel's mission statement and other information describing who we are and what we believe. This brochure was distributed throughout the year at various Chapel and Villages functions, including the Villages 4th of July festivities and the Fall Festival.

A marketing plan was created to provide strategies and guidance in promoting Chapel events throughout the year. Such strategies included:

- Creation of a Chapel Resource Guide
- Email blasts to Chapel members regarding specific events
- Fastlane email blasts to Village residents regarding selected events
- Distributing flyers in the Villages community promoting specific Chapel events
- Ads on Channel 26

Office & Volunteers Report 2017

The Chapel Office underwent some major redecoration during 2016/2017 and in early 2017 this was finally completed with the installation of the window blinds.

At the same time, the office PC was upgraded along with the large photocopier which allows us to print and provide our weekly bulletins as well as many other inserts, leaflets and flyers that we create and circulate throughout the year to both our congregation and the entire Villages community. We also purchased a new laptop for the use of our Pastor.

The office now has 'Mail Chimp' a software program which enables and allows mass emails to be sent simultaneously, so emails can now be sent to all our members who are online informing them of various Chapel events and notifications. Many thanks to Nick Yannaccone who showed me how to use this program.

We continue to use ATT as our telephone and internet provider and we were able to negotiate a 'bundle package deal' which saves the chapel office approximately \$1,500 + per annum.

The office continues to be the hub for the Chapel, its Sunday Worship Service, many Bible studies and social events throughout the year and our devoted congregation of whom many visit during Monday -Wednesday between 9am – 3pm when we are open.

Every Wednesday afternoon the office is filled with the joy of our trusted and devoted volunteers who faithfully assist each week with the preparation of the bulletin along with many other weekly tasks. Their support not only allows us to provide our beautiful bulletins each Sunday, but also enables us to make sure we reach out to the rest of our members who are unable to physically attend our service.

For our members who cannot receive emails, the volunteers mail out all the prayer requests from our Prayer Team along with our printed bulletins and sermon notes from our Pastor. This encourages and provides a sense of belonging to those who cannot be present at the Worship Service.

Please join me in giving praise and huge thanks to: Connie Jamrock, Helen Kim, JoAnne Utne, Amy French, Peggy Dorst, Genelle Foster, Dee McCurry and Adriana Warmerdam for their continued support and generous gift of their time. I am truly grateful to them all for being so happy, helpful and delightful to work with; our very own 'Chapel Office Angels'.

Jeanne Filice continues to be my hero who makes sure my typo's never reach your eyes! Thanks for Jeanne's acute ability to spot the 'sometimes funny and sometimes not so funny' blunders before they go into print! and save only the best for the Bulletin!

We continued to create and distribute invites to our Easter service, Entertainment evening and Christmas Cantata to all 2,400+ homes in the Villages last year. This is a considerable task and requires the co-ordination and co-operation of many volunteers to facilitate the delivery in an efficient and timely manner. Once again, many of our dedicated and loyal members stepped up and volunteered to help. So, so grateful!

We also initiated, in the latter half of the year, a Volunteer group to assist with driving members who can no longer drive themselves to our Sunday service. Jim Day kindly offered to facilitate this group and we now have 9 volunteers, one per month for each month throughout 2018.


We were so happy to receive 8 new members into our congregation this year. We hope to be able to get the word out about our remarkable Villages Community Chapel to more people in 2018.
